Before You Hitch: Safety Checklist

1. **Inspect the Hitch and Coupler**
 - Look for cracks, rust, or wear
 - Ensure the hitch ball matches the trailer coupler size
2. **Check the Trailer Connection**
 - Lower the coupler fully onto the hitch ball
 - Lock the latch and insert a safety pin or lock
3. **Attach Safety Chains**
 - Cross chains under the tongue in an "X" pattern
 - Leave enough slack for turning, but not dragging
4. **Connect Electrical Wiring**
 - Plug in the trailer lights and test brake lights, turn signals, and running lights
5. **Secure the Load**
 - Distribute weight evenly
 - Use straps or tie-downs to prevent shifting

While Driving

- Drive at safe speeds and allow extra stopping distance
- Brake and steer smoothly to maintain trailer control
- Take wide turns to avoid clipping curbs or objects
- Check mirrors frequently for trailer sway or issues

After the Trip

- Inspect the hitch and trailer for damage
- Report any issues to your supervisor immediately
- Store equipment properly to prevent wear and tear

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
